TRAVEL LIKE A

SKI INSTRUCTOR

Follow these expert tips to make the most of your time on the slopes

Whether you're a complete beginner or a black-run pro, it takes time to navigate a new mountain destination. We spoke with two instructors — Nathalie Nevins at Aspen Snowmass Ski Resort and Mike Evans of Vail Ski Resort — about how best to prepare for Colorado's world-class runs.

LOOK UPHILL WHEN YOU SET OFF AND GIVE RIGHT OF WAY TO THOSE DOWNHILL

WEAR THE RIGHT KIT

When it comes to clothing, comfort is key. "Layers and ventilation zippers will help combat changing conditions on the mountain, while not overdressing allows for easier movement," explains Mike. "An outer layer in a bright color helps others avoid you on the slopes and means friends can find you easily."

Nathalie adds: "Start with properly fitted boots — that's the foundation of comfort and control. For skis and snowboards, match the length and style to your ability and terrain, and always have bindings adjusted by a professional."



PICK SUITABLE RUNS

If a group has multiple ability levels, Mike recommends choosing a ski bowl with a variety of runs that cater to everyone. "Game Creek Bowl in Vail, for instance, has it all: a green run (Lost Boy), black runs (Faro Glade) and long bump runs (Wildcard). Since it's a bowl, all runs meet at one lift for easy navigation, so everyone can meet up and ride the lift together."

According to Nathalie, asking a local expert is a great starting point. "As a ski instructor, I still hire a local pro whenever I visit a new mountain. They'll share insider tips — from the best runs to hidden dining spots — and in just one day can show you where to ski, which aspects have the best snow at different times and how to make the most of the rest of your trip."



PUT SAFETY FIRST

"Knowing your ability and riding on appropriate terrain will make the experience more enjoyable and keep everyone safer," says Mike. "Before you set off down the hill, take a moment to think about the snow conditions, pace, other traffic on the mountain and navigation tactics."

For Nathalie, it's important to know and follow the Responsibility Code: "Stay in control, stop where you're visible, look uphill when you set off and give right of way to those downhill."

Where to Stay

Within walking distance of downtown Aspen, [The Innsbruck Aspen](#) has valet ski storage and a concierge who will pre-book lift passes. The pool and hot tub are ideal for relaxing after a day on the slopes. Just 40 minutes from Vail, [Valdoro Mountain Lodge, a Hilton Grand Vacations Club](#) is a cozy hideaway at the base of Breckenridge Ski Resort with views of the Rocky Mountains.

A Perfect Bite

Three wellness restaurants for feel-good dining



Haven Farm + Table

1200 Fox Point Farms Lane, Encinitas, CA 92024

Why Go

Opened last year at Fox Point Farms in Encinitas, Haven Farm + Table is the centerpiece of a 21-acre regenerative organic farm that blends hospitality with agriculture. The restaurant was created as a collaboration between farmers and chefs, with the goal of showcasing nutritious, seasonal produce grown just steps from the kitchen. The setting — complete with orchards, vegetable beds and a farmstand — makes it one of the most authentic farm-to-table experiences in North County.

What to Order

The menu changes frequently to reflect what's in season. Highlights include wood-fired flatbreads topped with just-harvested greens, pasture-raised chicken with roasted root vegetables and inventive vegetarian dishes. Brunch is especially popular, with options like farm-fresh frittatas, heirloom tomato salads and sourdough bread baked on site. Local craft beers and natural wines round out the experience.

Details

Haven sources directly from Fox Point Farms' regenerative fields and orchard, as well as neighboring small farms and producers. Nearly everything is made in-house, from sauces to breads, with an emphasis on sustainability and zero-waste cooking. The airy dining room overlooks the farm, and there's a patio for al fresco meals. A market and café on the property sell produce, eggs and pantry staples, so visitors can take a piece of the farm home.

Where to Stay

Family-friendly [MarBrisa, a Hilton Grand Vacations Club](#) is a Spanish Mediterranean-style resort in the seaside village of Carlsbad (around a 10-minute drive from the restaurant), and a great base for exploring the California coast. It features a pool, fitness center, volleyball courts and spa for downtime.

Why Go

Former raw food chef and health coach Summer Rose opened the grab-and-go Local Juicery (featured in our [Local Picks: Sedona video](#)) with her business partner Mike Sanders in 2014. Rose trained under plant-based expert Matthew Kenney and, nine years later, Wildcraft Kitchen followed. It has the same organic principles and wellness focus while combining the sit-down dining experience with a made-to-order juice bar.

What to Order

The menu has a wide variety of breakfast and lunch options from pancakes and frittatas to veggie-packed salads. Bestsellers include the breakfast sandwich filled with melted raw cheddar, tomato, poached egg, lemon caper aioli and arugula on sprouted sourdough. Another top pick is the honest bowl made with quinoa, cucumber, kalamata olives, house-made hummus, roasted sweet potatoes, pickled onions and a vegan caper aioli.

Details

Wildcraft Kitchen's smoothies and shakes have uplifting names like "utopia" and "fountain of youth." The coffee menu features different milk options, including easier-to-digest A2 whole milk, as well as oat and almond milk. Owner Summer has a passion for supporting organic and local farms, inspired by her father's work as a farmer, and she picks up compost daily from Local Juicery for his land.

Where to Stay

In the upper Sedona Plateau with epic desert views, [Sedona Summit, a Hilton Vacation Club](#) is perfectly positioned for backcountry adventures. The resort has an outdoor pool and several hot tubs, as well as a bocce court and hammock area.





Bloom Plant Based Kitchen

Why Go

When James Beard Award-nominated chef Rodolfo Cuadros' Latin American restaurant Amaru temporarily closed during the COVID-19 pandemic, he adapted by adding Bloom Plant Based Kitchen as a ghost kitchen. It was such a success that a brick-and-mortar space opened in Chicago's Wicker Park neighborhood in 2021.

What to Order

Serving only dinner during the week, the modern plant-based cuisine focuses on vegetables rather than meat substitutes. Try their inventive quick bites such as turnip causa served with potato croquette, nori and soy caviar; besitos de yuca bread balls with parmesan rosemary foam and spring tart with almond pesto cheese and beetroot. The ube cheesecake with Oreo crust and caramel popcorn topping is a dessert favorite.

Details

Other menus include the "2's Tuesday" — a three-course dinner for two on Tuesdays. Visit on the weekends for brunch or stop by for happy hour from 5–6 p.m., Sunday to Thursday.

One Coast, Five Ways: *Florida's Emerald Coast*

Head to this stretch of Florida's panhandle to enjoy the rhythm of the tides and fishing seasons, plus some of the clearest emerald waters found anywhere along the Gulf of Mexico

A vacation on the Emerald Coast between Perdido Key and Panama City revolves around the water. Fishing charters head out at dawn, paddleboarders skim across glassy bays and families spend their days wading at Norriego Point or exploring the rare dune lakes of Highway 30A. As the sun dips, crowds gather along Destin's boardwalk to watch the sky blaze orange and pink before settling into one of many restaurants serving the Gulf's freshest catch.

Whether you're after a romantic escape, a dose of adventure or simply time to bask in the sun, you'll find your authentic coastal vibe along this 24-mile stretch of dazzling shoreline.

For Beaches

Destin's coastline is among the most beautiful in the country, with stretches that are as varied as they are scenic. [Henderson Beach State Park](#) consistently ranks among the world's best, thanks to its sugar-white sands and clear waters. It's also a nesting ground for sea turtles — arrive at dawn or dusk for your best chance to spot them. For a quieter beach day, the knee-deep tide pools at [Norriego Point](#) offer a front-row seat to boats slipping in and out of the harbor, while nearby [East Jetty Point](#) is a favorite with snorkelers drawn to schools of tropical fish darting around the rocks.

To escape the noise altogether, head east along Highway 30A to discover rare coastal dune lakes, where freshwater meets saltwater in one of the few ecosystems of its kind in the world. It's a haven for birdwatching, peaceful kayaking or simply spreading out a picnic.

For Fishing & Water Adventures

Despite the rise of condos and resorts, Destin remains "The World's Luckiest Fishing Village." You feel it in the bustling harbor, where charter boats line up shoulder to shoulder, and in the seafood markets offering the fresh daily catch: snapper, grouper or cobia, depending on the season.

Beyond fishing, dolphin cruises, kayaking tours and snorkeling trips take you to man-made reefs and sunken wrecks now thriving with tropical fish and coral. Then there's [Crab Island](#), a submerged sandbar accessible only by boat, where waist-deep waters host a uniquely Destin experience — floating food vendors, volleyball games and live music. Be sure to go early, since it turns into a lively floating block party by noon.

For Exploring Coastal Towns

Destin may be the hub, but much of the Emerald Coast's character lies in the towns along scenic Highway 30A. [Rosemary Beach](#) feels like it's been plucked from Europe, with cobblestone lanes, gas-lit lanterns and Dutch-Caribbean architecture. Seaside is instantly recognizable for its pastel cottages and picket fences, immortalized in "The Truman Show." Grayton Beach has a bohemian vibe, with quirky art galleries, live-music bars and its playful motto: "Nice dogs, strange people."

For date night, head to the rooftop at [Pescado Seafood Grill & Rooftop Bar](#) in Rosemary Beach to take in the Gulf views paired with signature cocktails. Or [The Edge Seafood Restaurant](#) in Destin Harbor, which glows after dark with twinkling lights on the water.

For Families

The Emerald Coast's family attractions go well beyond the beach. [Big Kahuna's Water & Adventure Park](#) is an all-ages crowd pleaser, with wave pools, a lazy river and slides, while [The Track](#) offers go-karts, mini golf and bumper boats for kids who need a break from the sand. [Destin Commons](#), with its splash pad, movie theater and playground, makes for easy half-day outings.

For a dash of history, the [Destin History & Fishing Museum](#) showcases antique rods and reels alongside jaw-dropping mounts of record-setting catches, proof of how the town earned its nickname. On rainy days, the [Gulfarium Marine Adventure Park](#) in nearby Fort Walton Beach has dolphin and sea lion shows under covered seating. Or you can visit [Uncle Buck's Fishbowl & Grill](#) to let the kids bowl "underwater" among sharks and sea turtles.

For the Food Scene

Seafood here comes straight from the Gulf, often with a Southern twist. At [Dewey Destin's](#) and [The Back Porch](#), expect waterfront dining where fish tacos, fried shrimp and hush puppies are staples. For sunset meals with a view, [Bud & Alley's](#) in Seaside is a longtime favorite where you can order crab cakes paired with a cocktail.

Families love [Lulu's Destin](#), a lively beachside spot where kids can paddleboard in a protected lagoon while parents dig into shrimp and grits or a classic po'boy. For toes-in-the-sand dining, [The Crab Trap](#) delivers Gulf grouper sandwiches and a fun tiki-bar vibe best enjoyed at sunset. Skip the peak dinner rush and head there for breakfast. Locals swear by the sushi-grade tuna omelet — a quirky favorite in Destin.

Where to Stay

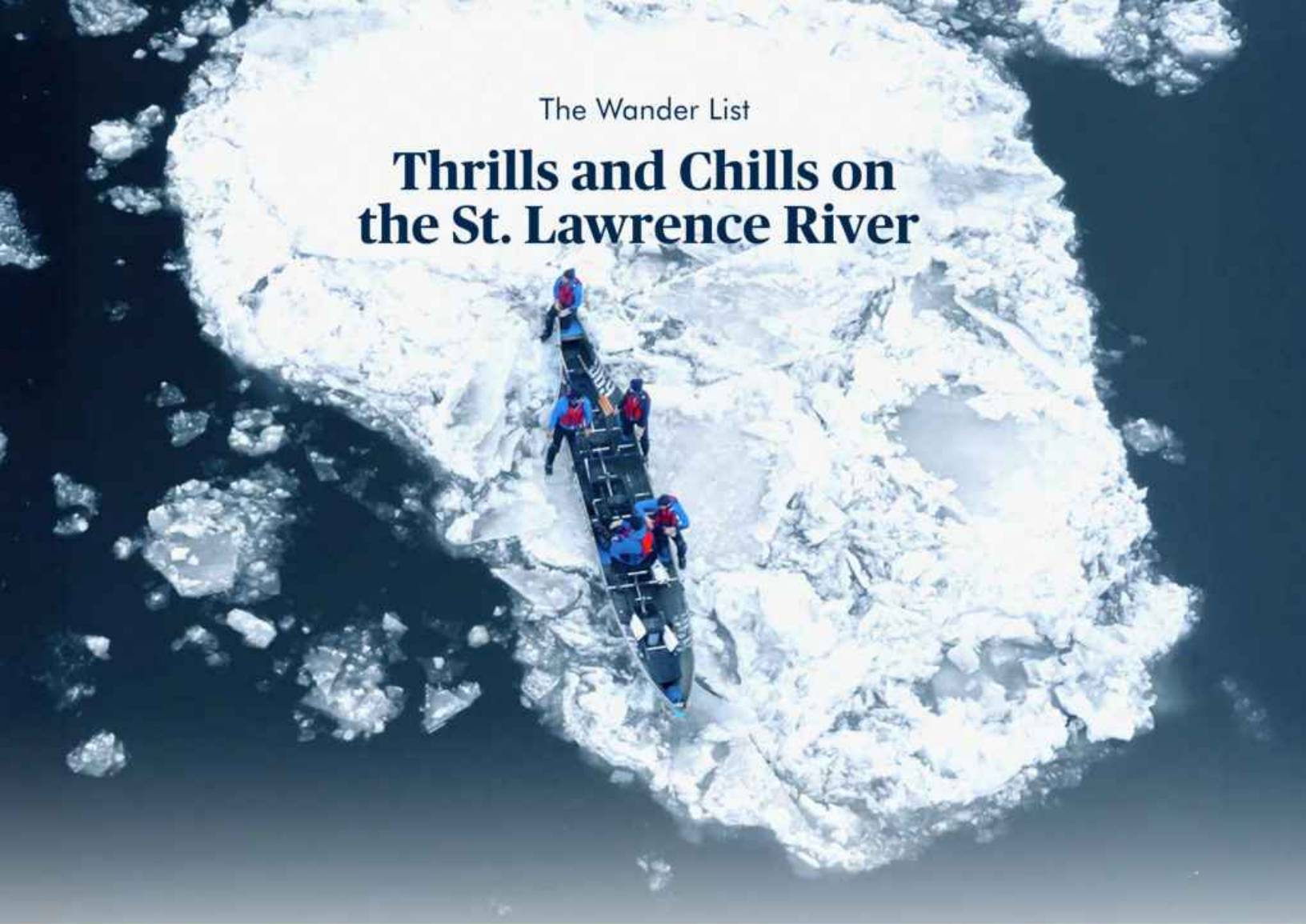

The Wander List

Thrills and Chills on the St. Lawrence River



One of Quebec's oldest and rarest sports is also its most exciting

Crampons and paddles, while not an obvious pairing, are both essential for one of Canada's most unique sports — ice canoeing. Part rowing, part running, the sport began in the 17th century, as a necessary means of ferrying people and goods across the frozen St. Lawrence River. As the centuries passed, maritime technology improved and bridges were built, but ice canoeing remained a beloved local pastime and a key piece of Quebec's cultural heritage.

Today, ice canoeing is a popular tourist activity in the region's picturesque capital, Quebec City. Eager to try it for myself during a recent visit, I donned a woolly "toque" and signed up for an outing with local operators [Canot à Glace Expérience](#).

Arriving at the company's waterfront boathouse in a gentle snow flurry, I'm handed a steaming cup of tea and an armful of kit — everything from ice hockey-style knee pads and waterproof mittens to wetsuit socks and the trusty racing crampons.

"Teamwork and timing are going to be essential today," explains my guide, Julien Harvey, a third-generation ice canoeist. "Out on the river, it's all about mastering the transition between water and ice as smoothly as possible."

That all-important “transition,” I learn, involves sliding your oar into the boat, then swinging a leg out to replace it. In tandem with your crewmates, you push with all your might, similar to starting a motorbike. Once you reach open water again, it’s legs in and oars out, just as swiftly.

The “scootering” across a solid mass is what sets ice-canoeing apart from other watersports, and competitive champions like Julien apart from his rivals. Add the strong currents and capricious winds of the St. Lawrence River, and you have a sport that’s both physical and unpredictable. To combat this, the boats are longer and heavier than standard canoes and have reinforced rubber-bottomed hulls that allow them to glide over ice and withstand heavy or unexpected impacts.

Fortunately, the snow has stopped, and the sky has sharpened itself into a deep midwinter blue as we push off for the far shore. There are three other curious tourists alongside me, with Julien steering from the stern.

As we bounce and glide across the river through the ice, slush and current, I’m surprised by how quickly we fall into a rhythm. Approaching each iceberg at speed, we listen for Julien’s shout before swinging our bodies through 180 degrees, planting one knee inside the boat and one foot outside it, crampons crunching their way across. Plopping back into the water on the other side of the floe, our 10-foot wooden oars slip back out, and it’s time to propel our arms again.



We make our way across Quebec’s great tidal artery in this fashion, not feeling cold despite seeing our breath frosting as we toil. About half an hour later, we’re close to the shore and Julien steers us onto a particularly sturdy iceberg for a breather. Stepping out onto the ice, he produces a flask of hot cocoa to toast our achievement in a Canadian brouhaha of back slaps and high fives.

Gazing back at where we started, I’m struck by how truly beautiful Quebec City is. Nicknamed “The Paris of North America,” the grand old capital of New France looks like a fortified fairytale — all bristling spires and cobblestone streets, winding up to its magnificent clifftop citadel.

Like the rest of this picture-perfect place, ice canoeing is a unique, unforgettable means of getting deep into the city’s history. As we push and pull back to our starting point, warmed by both the cocoa and the views, it makes perfect sense to me that those early French settlers would want to fight for their futures here — even if that involved creating an entirely new means of transportation to do so.

Where to Stay

Once known as Hollywood's Playground, Palm Springs has provided an escape for stars needing a little R&R since the 1920s. 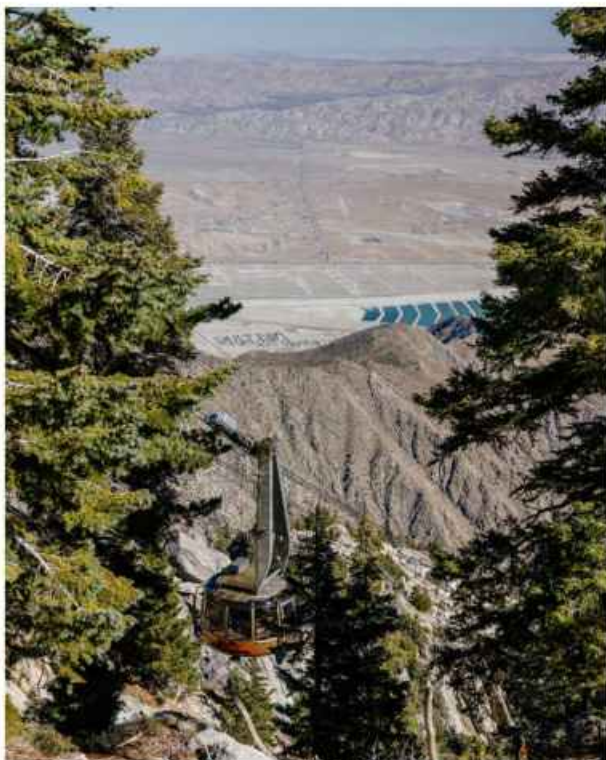

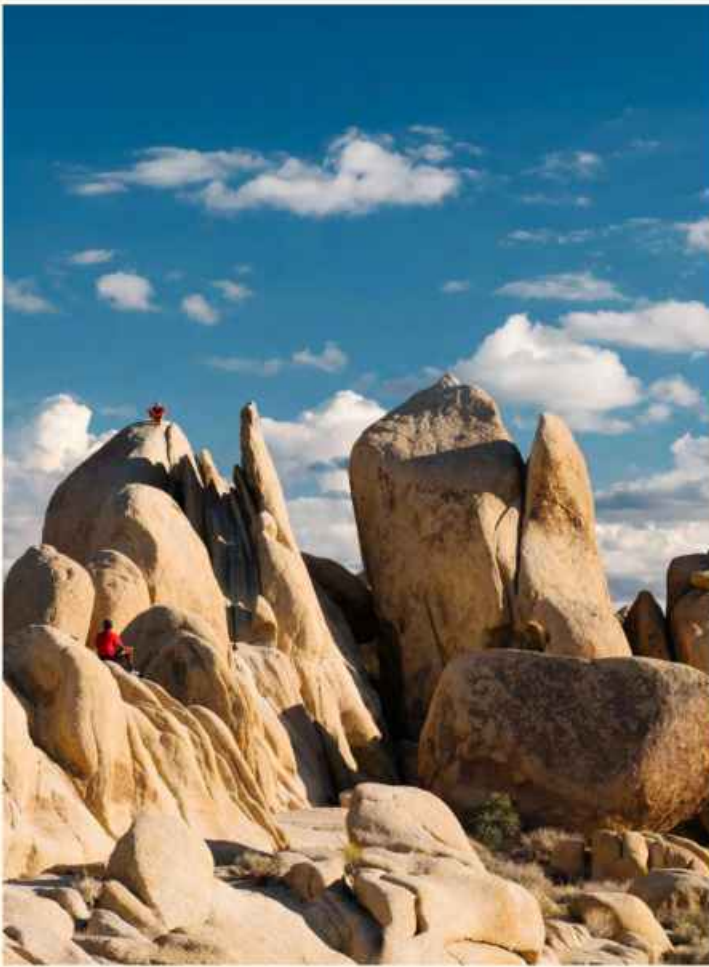

Day one 9 A.M.
